Who Are Homeless Students?

- Living with a friend, relative or someone else because they lost their home or their family is having temporary financial problems;
- Staying in a motel, hotel, trailer park, or campground because they have nowhere else to go;
- Living in a shelter, including emergency or transitional shelters, domestic violence shelters, and runaway and home-less youth shelters;
- Staying in substandard housing;
- Living in places not ordinarily used for sleeping, including cars, parks, public places, abandoned buildings, or bus or train stations;
- Abandoned in a hospital.

What Are Their Rights?

- Remain in school of origin.
- No barriers to enrollment. Enroll immediately, without typically required records such as proof of residency, immunizations, school records, or other papers. Assist with acquisition of birth certificates and/or immunization records.
- Free lunch and Title I services.
- Transportation services- CATA passes, mileage reimbursement, school bus.
- Homeless services continue for entire school year, and on case-by-case basis into next school year.
- Challenge decisions made by schools and districts.

Services Available at East Lansing Public Schools Include:

- Clothing: Hats, gloves, shoes, socks, under wear.
- Goodwill vouchers for other clothing items
- Backpacks with school supplies, hygiene items, etc.
- Transportation assistance- CATA passes, reimbursement, bus
- Graduation expenses-cap and gown, senior pictures, announcements
- College applications, scholarships, and FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- Other items upon request to ensure student's ability to successfully attend school
