Counseling Appointments

Scheduling

In an effort to allow students to have more control over their courses/schedules and to move our students towards college and career readiness, we have changed the scheduling process for the 2019/2020 school year. Students will have the opportunity to look at the master schedule and select the hours that they wish to take their classes. The schedules that are created will be dependent on the availability of courses (seats) at the time of registration...

Students met with their counselors in grade level assemblies in the theater before the spring break holiday. Registration materials including the Course Description Book and master schedule are available on the Student Services web page. Student scheduling appointments begin the week of April 15th. The process is as follows:

- Student registration for the 2019-2020 school year will take place during periods 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6 in the library computer lab.
 - Class of 2020 (juniors)- April 16th, 17th, 18th, 19th, and 22nd
 - Class of 2021 (sophomores)- April 24th, 25th, 26th, 29th, 30th and May 1st
 - Class of 2022 (freshmen)- May 3rd, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, and 13th
 - As time allows, there will be make-up appointments for students who miss their registration timeslot.
- Students have been randomly assigned individual 10-minute appointments during their assigned week. These appointments are posted outside the Student Services Office area. Completed registration forms and fouryear plans should be brought to this appointment in the library computer lab. Students should also bring with them any questions they may have for their counselor.
- Students are required to complete the registration sheet and the four year plan/EDP (found on the back side of the registration sheet). The master schedule for school year 2019 - 2020 and course description book are posted online at the high school Student Services web page.
- Students will leave their scheduling appointment with their schedule for the 2019-2020 school year. Printed copies will not be available... but students will be allowed and encouraged to take a photo of their schedule. Schedules for the 2019 2020 school year will be released to a student's powerschool account once we have made the switch from the 2018/2019 school year to the 2019/2020 school year.

Testing Out Procedure

East Lansing High School 2019-20 Testing Out Information and Application Form Test Dates: Tuesday, August 6 & 13, 2019

Students who demonstrate a competency level equivalent to or exceeding the standard of the required courses for graduation may request a test to proceed to the next course.

Testing Out Procedure:

Students who demonstrate competency level equivalent to or exceeding the standard of the required courses for graduation may request to proceed to the next course:

The student and/or student's parent/guardian must submit the request form to test out, available online under the Student Services web page. Return the form to the Student Services Office by the due date of the current school year for all subjects.

- 1. Student materials will be checked out to all students. A deposit check must be rendered at the time of check out.
- 2. A student must earn a 78% or above to pass a test out exam. A "pass" will be recorded on the transcript with no impact on the student's grade point average. A test out credit can be used to fulfill a requirement within a subject area or to advance into the next course in a sequence. A test out credit cannot be used to fulfill one of the twenty-two credits required to graduate from East Lansing High School. Example: A student who successfully tests out of English I satisfies one year of required English and can move into English II, but this English I credit cannot be counted toward to the twenty-two credits required for graduation from ELHS.
- 3. To maintain the security of these tests, the curricular chair will review the test results with the student if requested, but the test will not be returned to the student.
- 4. A test out may only be attempted once per class.
- 5. A test out exam must be taken during the published test out dates.

Applications are on-line and are due May 24, 2019 in the ELHS Student Services Office. Materials will be distributed the week after school is out for a \$70 per course deposit to be returned on the test date in August with returned materials.

Course Material Loan:

- 1. Study materials will be checked out to all students Monday Wednesday, June 10-12, 2019, in the Student Services office. Check out times are 8-11 am and 1-3 pm.
- 2. A \$70 deposit check must be rendered at the time of materials check out for <u>each</u> textbook checked out. Checks will be returned when books are returned on the testing date. Payment must be submitted in the form of a check. Cash and credit cards are not accepted.


Community Darkroom 517 Featured in 2019 Capital City Film Festival

GET A HEAD START ON COLLEGE BY TAKING AN AFTER SCHOOL DUAL ENROLLMENT ART CLASS!

During the 2019-2020 school year, ELHS students can select to take a college art classes at East Lansing High School, through a Dual Enrollment partnership with Kendall College of Art and Design. In the fall, first semester, ELHS will be offering the KCAD class: DESIGN & COLOR 113. This class is a computer graphics class that emphasizes design concepts. It is a foundation class for most college art programs and will give the student a strong grasp of design knowledge and experience using Adobe Creative Suite. Both Adobe Illustrator and Photo Shop are programs often used in colleges and in the design industry. Second semester ELHS will be offering the KCAD class, COLOR 112. This is a painting class with the "focus on problem-solving and studying the properties and interactions of color". This class utilizes a variety of subject matter, including landscape, cityscape and still lives using gouache, watercolor and acrylic paint.

TIMES / LOCATION

All junior and senior high school students, who meet the requirements below and are interested in enhancing their Visual Art academic experience should stop in to room to see Mrs. Remer-Saenz or contact her at Robin.remersaenz@elps.us for details. **The student teacher ratio in this class, 10-1 maximum, which is unheard of!** Students receive *3 college credits* and *.5 ELHS credits* for the Color 112 class. The class meets *two days a week*, after school on Monday and Wednesday after school, from 2:45 until 6:00 in the ELHS art classroom. Students taking the class, as a high school and college credit, will be required to have one less class during the school day, therefore having 5 regular ELHS classes for the semester. I recommend, for student productiveness, to take 4th or 6th hour as their open period.

APPLICATION / ELIGIBILITY

This dual Enrollment is open to ELHS students who meet 2 of the following requirements:

- Successfully complete 2 visual art classes. **OR**
- Recommended by a high school art teacher. See me if you did not have art at ELHS but have had experiences elsewhere.
- A portfolio review with a Dual Enrollment teacher or a KCAD admissions advisor, may be needed.
- Print and complete the dual enrollment New KCAD Student Approval form. Turn in with signatures.
- Print and complete the **ELHS dual Enrollment form**, (on ELHS website). Turn in with signatures.
- Have your counselor put a KCAD placeholder in your schedule for the class.
- Request an official copy of your high school transcript to be sent to submit to the Kendall College of Art and Design.
- If you are a new KCAD student, complete the Kendall Dual Enrollment Registration on the KCAD website, found under Admissions, click on undergraduate registration. Fill out the form in its entirety.

 Our School Code is 231300 You will also need to type in your SS# for State funding purposes.

If you are planning on taking the fall class, <u>Design & Color 113</u>, please complete the 2 bolded forms above ASAP, with signatures & drop it off to Ms. McGraw in the office to get staff signatures. You can also register for spring class, <u>Color 112 now</u>, Although the Application Deadline for it is November 2019, you will need to do your paperwork to place it on your schedule for next spring now. See Mrs. Remer-Saenz or Ms. McGraw in counseling for application procedures.

FINANCIAL

For ELHS students, as well as most area high school students, the cost of dual enrollment will be supplemented by the school district. For our East Lansing High School students, the district will cover most of the cost with the student paying the remaining balance of approximately \$150.00. Taking the same class at Kendall College would cost almost \$2,000.00

KCAD is a part of Ferris State University and is a nationally acclaimed college of art and design whose statewide Dual Enrollment program has proven benefits for students.
