Principal's Letter

Dear East Lansing High School Families:

Recently our counseling staff met with 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students to begin the 2018-19 school year course selection process. Students will have the opportunity to design their course schedule for next year. A team of high school teachers, counselors and administrators recently attended a Rethinking Master Scheduling seminar and will apply the information and tools learned as we review the preliminary course selection information and draft a master schedule. This phase of the process will allow us to explore various scheduling scenarios and develop the final version of the master schedule in a timely, constructive manner. As we continue to discuss course options with students, we remind them to work closely with their counselor and to review their transcript and academic progress as they pursue their high school diploma and future endeavors. We appreciate your support in this area too.

Kudos to Maggie Moore, ELHS Math teacher, for her foresight and sensitivity regarding the topic of adolescent masculinity and for arranging the viewing of the movie The Mask You Live In at ELHS on February 6. One hundred and forty three people attended. Afterward, many participated in a dialogue related to gender issues and the development and perception of the role of males, particularly teenagers, in our society. Ms. Moore also arranged multiple dialogues to be held during our EXCEL period to further discuss this topic. We look forward to continuing these conversations among our students and supporting them as they mature and pursue their place in the global society.

The East Lansing Robotics Team will be participating in the regional championship on Saturday, February 17. The team, comprised of 15 students, is excited and looking forward to the chance to participate in the state championship at Michigan State University later this month. Good luck ELHS Robotics Team!

As mentioned in the previous Parentline, East Lansing School High School is taking part in the Michigan Profile for Healthy Youth survey (MiPHY). The survey, supported by the Michigan Departments of Education and Health and Human Services, researches the health behaviors of 9th and 11th grade students. Ninth grade students have recently completed the survey; our 11th grade students will complete the survey on Thursday, February 15.

On January 28 the East Lansing Science Olympiad teams competed at the Haslett Invitational tournament against 30 teams from 21 high schools across the state. The EL Blue team took home a third place trophy overall; their best showing ever in four years since the club began. Way to go Trojans! The team's next tournament is March 24. This is an important regional tournament against 14 area high schools to determine the top four teams that will go on to the state championship tournament on April 28. The team meets every Friday after school in Mr. Heinrich's classroom (room 424). If your student is interested, he/she is welcome to attend.

The East Lansing Bowling program is going strong with a record 21 participants this year. Of the 21 bowlers, 8 of them are graduating seniors and the rest are freshman and sophomores with the exception of two. The bowling team is part of the CAAC red division and competes December thru February culminating with a regional/state tournament end of February. Scheduling

All 9th, 10th, and 11th graders at ELHS have received their scheduling materials after attending a presentation given by the counselors during recent excels. All students will have a scheduling appointment with their counselor (special education students will meet with their caseload teacher). Appointments can be found listed outside the student services office, students need to visit to find their appointment time. Individual Meeting times will occur on the following dates: Juniors: Feb 21st, 22nd, and 23rd

Dear Parent/Guardian:

East Lansing High School has gone paperless by scheduling parent-teacher conferences online for *conferences held on Tuesday, March 20, 2018 and Thursday, March 22, 2018*. The *scheduling window will open to parents on Wednesday, February 28, 2018* at noon and *will close on Friday, March 16th at noon*.

To schedule your preferred time for a parent-teacher conference:

- 1. Go to https://www.myconferencetime.com/demo/searchschool/
- 2. Click on the name of your child's teacher.
- 3. Select the desired date/time for your conference by clicking on "Sign Up."
- 4. Submit the requested information. Make sure you leave at least 5 minutes in between conference times.

If you have several children attending our school, click on "Register for Multiple Conferences" and follow the prompts to schedule your children for several conferences.

After you schedule a conference online, the date and time are reserved for you. If you entered your email address correctly, you will receive email confirmation of your conference.

If you need to review your conferences, go to

<u>https://www.myconferencetime.com/elhs/</u>. On the bottom of the page you will notice a gray task bar. Click on "Help me find conferences that I already scheduled." It will prompt you to enter your email address. Then you will notice in your inbox, a note from the company. If you open that email there will be a link. Click on the link and your schedule will appear in order of time and teacher.

If you are unable to sign up for a time and date online, you can come into the main office at the ELHS and use a computer to schedule your conferences or send a note with three preferred times and dates to your child's teacher. Once the teacher receives your note, he/she will attempt to schedule a conference for your desired date and time but cannot guarantee your top choices as time slots fill up quickly.

Science Enrollment and the Class of 2022

In 2015, Michigan adopted the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), now known as the Michigan Science Standards (MSS). The NGSS science standards connect the three dimensions of science instruction and learning: science and engineering practices, disciplinary core ideas, and cross cutting concepts through a student-centered approach. NGSS instruction will also emphasize improving critical thinking skills through collaborative processes.

On January 22, 2018, the East Lansing School Board approved changes to the East Lansing High School science curriculum for the class of 2022. Incoming freshmen, and subsequent graduating classes, will be required to earn one credit in each of these courses in this order: Physical Science, Life Science, and Earth and Space Science. Students will still be required to earn a total of three credits for graduation.
