We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Donley Elementary School. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Donley Elementary was identified as a school that no label was given.

At Donley Elementary School, our primary focus is fostering academic excellence. As a school and district, we are dedicated to meeting each student where they are, addressing learning gaps that may have arisen over the past two school years, and providing targeted support to ensure their success. Our educators continually refine instructional practices, monitor student progress, and adapt teaching strategies to create a responsive and effective learning environment

Description of School

Donley Elementary currently serves 278 students across kindergarten through fifth grade, with two sections per grade level. Our dedicated staff remains committed to meeting the diverse needs of all students. We analyze school-wide data at least



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three times per year (fall, winter, and spring) to assess progress, refine instructional delivery, and narrow the achievement gap between students performing at benchmark levels and those requiring additional support.

As part of East Lansing Public Schools, we collaborate with our K-5 counterparts to ensure a high-quality educational experience for all students. Our upper-grade teachers utilize team teaching strategies to ease the transition from early elementary (K-3) self-contained classrooms to the six-period structure of middle school.

To foster a safe and supportive learning environment, we implement comprehensive programs focused on academic and social-emotional growth. This includes:

- **Second Step Curriculum** A research-based program designed to promote social-emotional learning.
- **Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS)** A school-wide framework for fostering positive behaviors.
- **Bucket Filler Program** A reward system that reinforces kindness, responsibility, and community values.

Our instructional staff collaborates to review student data, develop action plans, and refine curriculum to align with best practices. Through updated curriculum, evidence-based teaching strategies, and integrated technology, we cultivate an environment where all students can reach their full potential and exceed the high academic standards set by East Lansing Public Schools.

This ongoing work is a collective effort of students, teachers, support staff, and administration. At Donley Elementary, we firmly believe that student success is maximized when families and schools work in partnership. We are committed to providing a rich, engaging, and supportive educational experience for every child.

Parent Teacher Conferences

At parent-teacher conferences this year we had 93.7 % of families attend. In 2022-23 96.4 % attended and in 2021-22 97.4 attended.

Status of the 3-5 Year District School Improvement Plan

East Lansing Public Schools has submitted a District Improvement Plan through the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). This plan is focused on the whole child by developing school environments that are healthy, safe, engaged, supported and challenged. Our plan, in conjunction with our school community improves learning and improves health while coordinating policy, processes and practices that meet the needs of our students, educators and families. Description of Implementation

The implementation of the core curriculum is sustained through a curriculum structure that employs grade level and department chairpersons who meet monthly. The District and School Leaders review state requirements for core curriculum, plans curriculum development, coherence and articulation, provides for the identification of necessary professional development and budget-related requirements to support the implementation of the curriculum. The District and School Leaders meet with grade level and or department level colleagues and with administration to implement and monitor the effectiveness of curriculum development, implementation and impact on student performance.



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Process for Assigning Pupils to the School District

K-5 students are assigned to schools based on where they reside in our district. Each K-5 school has specific boundaries within our district. Parents are allowed the opportunity to complete a permeable boundary request that would allow their child to attend a school within the school district other than their neighborhood school. Requests require the approval of the sending and receiving school Principals as well as the Superintendent and are based on space availability at the school/grade.

East Lansing Public Schools also participates in the state's Schools of Choice process annually. Available openings are advertised. Applications are accepted during a specific application period, and students are accepted on a lottery system to fill the advertised slots.
