We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for East Lansing High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school was identified as a school that "has not been given one of these labels".

As a school we are striving for academic excellence. For the 2021-2022 school year, students performed well on the MME assessments with 58% of students proficient in all subjects. For the 2020-2021 school year, due to the COVID 19 pandemic and many students learning virtually, the eleventh grade MME assessments were optional, which include the SAT, ACT WorkKeys, and M-Step exams. For the 2019-2020 school year, schools were shut down in the state of Michigan due to the COVID 19 pandemic, so students were not administered the M-STEP state assessment. As a school and a district, we are working to meet all the students where they are and fill in any learning gaps that may have occurred during the last two school years. We are continually working to improve and support our students in their academic, social and emotional growth and monitor that growth and adjust our instruction and student support services accordingly.

Our academic success is a result of the strong community of students, teachers, families and community members that work hard each and every day. The East Lansing High School staff is committed to teaching all students with differentiated instruction and continuing to build the socioemotional skills of our students. We value and welcome the support from our East Lansing community, through active family involvement, volunteer opportunities, and our East Lansing High School Parent Council.

Parent Teacher Conferences

We had about 22% of our students represented by a parent at Parent Teacher Conferences last school year and for the 2020-21 school year.

Number of College Equivalent Courses Offered

In 2021-22, East Lansing High School offers 20 Advanced Placement courses. Enrollment includes 664 students, or 54% of the student population. In the most recent year of testing, 302 students, or 72%, received scores of 3 or higher. With a score of 3 or higher is considered passing and in most cases is considered college credit.

Process for Assigning Pupils to the School District

9-12 grade students attend East Lansing High School reside within the East Lansing School District boundary.

East Lansing Public Schools also participate in the state's Schools of Choice process annually. Available openings are advertised. Applications are accepted during a specific application period, and students are accepted on a lottery system to fill the advertised slots.

Description of Implementation

The implementation of the core curriculum is sustained through a curriculum structure that employs grade level and department chairpersons who meet monthly. These educators review state requirements for the core curriculum, plan curriculum development, ensure coherence and articulation, and provide for the identification of necessary professional development and budget-related requirements to support the implementation of the curriculum. Department and grade level chairpersons meet with grade level and or department level colleagues and with administration to implement and monitor the effectiveness of curriculum development, implementation and impact on student performance.
