Instructional Coaching - A district instructional coach will provide coaching sessions with teachers to develop deep knowledge of mathematical understanding and application to daily instruction. This will be guided by MTSS, assessment, curriculum alignment, and pedagogic understanding supported by the instructional coache to improve the delivery of instruction and improved student perfromance.
