I. Role of Parent Councils

- 1. Act as a liaison between stakeholders:
 - Families
 - Administration
 - Educators
- 2. Provide funding support for classroom and extracurricular activities.
- 3. Provide and communicate volunteer opportunities.
- 4. Provide parent-teacher-admin communication support
 - Parent-teacher conference prep support; provide prep page for parents on questions to be asked.
 - Provide school directories for use by families and staff.
 - Transitioning students and their families includes private to public, out of district to in-district, one school building to another.
- 5. Provide forum for discussions with the principal
 - Examples: Examine building MEAP scores; bring forth topics of concern that are shared by multiple parents.
- 6. Act as ambassadors for school
 - Actively welcome families to the school community.
 - Invite a wide variety of parents to be part of council committee leadership so that ALL sub-groups feel included and represented.
 - Be alert and listen for parent or school issues that are pertinent for future council meeting discussions.

II. Role of District Parent Council (DPC)

- 1. Establish and provide "best practices" for all council meetings/governance.
- 2. Provide Council leadership training.
- Monitor school-specific issues as needed; watch for multi-school issues that should be addressed at a district council level. Act as a liaison between school councils and BOE when necessary
- 4. Provide forum for discussions with superintendent and BOE.
