Finally, I look forward to a great month of October as we continue on into the school year. It's shaping up to be a great one!

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
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News from Student Services

Tutoring and Academic Support Tutoring and Academic Support is now available in the ELHS media center. The after school program runs M, W, and Th from 2:50 pm to 4:00 pm. This program is staffed with volunteers from Michigan State University, ELHS students, parent volunteers, and the ELHS counselors.

Because every student needs to succeed in completing graduation requirements, academic support is offered to any student who may be struggling in a particular class or who may need a quiet supervised setting for homework. Computers with Internet access and printers are available in the library media center for student use. Students are required to sign in and a quiet atmosphere is






Join the Fun! Jr/Sr Activities sign up is here!

GENERAL CHAIR PEOPLE (2) for overseeing all the activities. These people will make sure that all the committees are on track as well as hold monthly meetings at the high school. In addition, they will communicate with administration as the events get closer.



FOOD CHAIRPERSON for post prom. This person will have a committee that will be in charge of deciding what food to have at post prom, getting the food to the high school, and setting it up. This job is an easy job, with most of the work done in the spring.



PARENT FUNDRAISERS (2) This position requires obtaining donations from ELHS Jr/Sr parents to help fund the activities.
