#### Student Services – November 2021



Spring 2022, all 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the PSAT, and all 11<sup>th</sup> grade students will take the MME which includes the SAT, M-Step and WorkKeys. While these are statemandated tests, they allow our 9<sup>th</sup> /10<sup>th</sup> grade students to experience a standardized testing situation before taking the SAT. The 11<sup>th</sup> grade SAT state mandated test allows all students to have a college reportable score,

which can open up the college door for our students.



Students should make themselves a student account at the <a href="https://www.collegeboard.com">www.collegeboard.com</a> (SAT/PSAT). This is where they will manage their test results, have access to test prep, and have access to career and college exploration. The college/career

exploration features are top notch... and can be very helpful for students trying to figure out where their next journey will take them.



Khan Academy offers free SAT test prep/practice for all students. Visit satpractice.org/k12 to get your students started. The great thing about Khan is that you can link your Khan account with your College Board account. This helps with test prep!



The FAFSA is now open for the graduating class of 2022 to fill out. The FAFSA determines the amount of financial aid (loans, grants, scholarships, etc) that your student may be eligible for. The deadline for Michigan students to receive optimal consideration is March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022.... but don't wait until then.

Student Services highly recommends that seniors have their college applications completed and submitted by October 31<sup>st</sup>. Many colleges/universities use a November 1<sup>st</sup> date as their early application deadline for optimal application consideration... so setting October 31<sup>st</sup> (Halloween) as their personal deadline will ensure that they submit their application on time.



Is your student looking for a work permit, a free-reduced lunch form, etc? These forms are available in student services. Students are welcome to take them right from the rack near our front door.



Seventh semester transcripts will be available for students in the graduating class of 2022 at the end of January. Many colleges will request 7<sup>th</sup> semester transcripts from our students. After winter break, students may request their 7<sup>th</sup> semester transcripts through Parchment.com for noncommon app schools.



The Wilson Talent Center (WTC) will host an Open House on Wednesday, December 8, 2021 from 4:30-7:30 pm for prospective students for the 2022-23 school year. 


