Principal's Letter

Friday, February 12, 2016 8:00 AM

Dear ELHS Families,

I like to highlight a few items from communication previously sent on February 9, 2016.

• We will hold individual class discussions on Thursday, February 18 during Excel. From 9:39 to 1 0:25, students will remain in their 211u hour classes where they will view a presentation that addresses pertinent issues relating to the tragedies we have faced as a school, and will then engage in a brief: guided discussion with their 211c1 period teacher. A mental health professional will be present in each classroom, as well, to respond to student questions and participate in the discussion. These discussions will replace the schoolwide assembly originally planned. We made this change based on recommendations that a schoolwide assembly is not likely to sufficiently engage all of our students, while a smaller group setting provides a much more meaningful context for learning and discussion. We will share with parents the information discussed with students so that parents may continue the discussion over the weekend should they wish to do so.

• A parent forum will take place on Wednesday, February 24 from 6:00 pm to approximately 7:30pm. This Corum will consist of a large group session during which we will share useful information regarding teen mental and emotional health. This infom1ation session will be followed by small group breakout sessions where parents will be able to have more intimate discussions with school officials and mental health professionals.

As they become available, resources will be posted on the Student Services web page.
Finally. our counselors. administrators and faculty have been and continue to make themselves available for student visits according to the students' needs. We will. of course, respect the privacy of the students we see for mental health issues, but please know we are caring for those students with immediate needs and are helping them access the longer-term help they need. If the demand for counseling services exceeds our ability to provide these services, the crisis team will ensure that more counseling staff are brought to campus.

We will continue to communicate with you as more information becomes available.

Scheduling

Student registration for the 2016-2017 school year will take place from Tuesday, February 16 through Wednesday, March 2 during periods 1, 2, 3, 5 and 6. Students have been assigned randomized appointments by class in random order. Appointment times are posted on the bulletin board outside of Student Services.

Scheduling will be completed by the time students leave for the school year. It is very important for students to make their scheduling time and keep the process moving forward in a timely manner.

Grade Reports Needed for Inclusion on Transcripts

Students who took an on-line class or any class outside of the building (VHS, LCC, etc) need to bring in their final grade report to Student Services to have it entered on their transcript.

The Early College

The Early College at LCC is accepting applications for next year's Class. If you are a sophomore and wish to learn more about The Early College please stop in the Student Services office and ask to speak to Mr. Bedolla. The deadline for turning in your application is March 28th, 2014.

Senior Parents

The end of the school year is coming up fast so please do not let your student get complacent. Keep encouraging them to work hard in their classes. Colleges do take into account your students 8th and final semester grades. They are almost there!

Seventh Semester Transcripts

Seventh semester transcripts were available for students in the graduating class of 2016 at the end of January. Many colleges will request 7th semester transcripts from our students. The 7th Semester Router Form is now available in Student Services.

- Direct to College Students may request their 7th semester transcripts through parchment.com at any time, but in order to process this request, Student Services staff must receive a completed router form from the student. If the student would like a hard-copy transcript sent to a college/university, the office will need a stamped, addressed envelope to process this request.
- Common App If the original application was submitted through common app, a router form needs to be filled out and submitted to student services. This lets your counselor know to attach

your 7th semester transcript to your common app.

FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)...

- The FAFSA (*Free Application for Federal Student Aid*) is the first step in the financial aid process. Use it to apply for federal student financial aid, such as Pell grant, student loans, and college work-study.
- In addition, most states and schools use FAFSA information to award their financial aid.

Common Application - New Developments for Juniors

The Common Application has announced that the 2016-2017 personal statement essay prompts will be the same as the 2015-2016 prompts. They have released these prompts for students to start working on. The prompts can be found below..... it would be a good use of your student's time to start working on these high stakes essays early.

2016-2017 Essay Prompts

1. Some students have a background, identity, interest, or talent that is so meaningful they believe their application would be incomplete without it. If this sounds like you, then please share your story.

2. The lessons we take from failure can be fundamental to later success. Recount an incident or time when you experienced failure. How did it affect you, and what did you learn from the experience?

3. Reflect on a time when you challenged a belief or idea. What prompted you to act? Would you make the same decision again?

4. Describe a problem you've solved or a problem you'd like to solve. It can be an intellectual challenge, a research query, an ethical dilemma - anything that is of personal importance, no matter the scale. Explain its significance to you and what steps you took or could be taken to identify a solution.

5. Discuss an accomplishment or event, formal or informal, that marked your transition from childhood to adulthood within your culture, community, or family.

News From Ms. Hmadi's Room

Ms. Hmadi's English II students are reading Amy Tan's novel The Joy Luck Club. Ms. Hmadi has collaborated with Karen Klein, of the MSU program *Lattice*, to supplement her students' understanding of Asian culture, by arranging three classroom visits of visiting MSU professors from China. Latice is an outreach program sponsored by MSU with the mission of "linking all types of teachers to international crosscultural education". On February 9th, the professors visited Ms. Hmadi's classroom and were taught the history and cultural significance of Asian calligraphy. ELHS STUDENTS CAN GET A HEAD START ON COLLEGE BY TAKING A KENDALL COLLEGE of ART & DESIGN CLASS, RIGHT HERE AT ELHS!

East Lansing High School students have a unique opportunity to take prestigious Kendall College of Art and Design class here at our own school, through our Dual Enrollment partnership with KCAD. Students will earn 3 college credits on successful completion of the class, without a rigorous exam.

This is a great way for highly motivated students, who are strong in art, to get a jump on college classes or take an advanced art class while avoiding scheduling problems. During the 2016-2017 year, Mrs. Remer-Saenz, will be offering two Kendall College of Art and Design classes. During first semester we will be offering, **Design and Color, (KCGD 113),** which is a computer based graphic design/ digital media class. This class is an introduction to the visual and verbal vocabularies of design and color theory as they relate to graphic design. The class will focus on the elements and principals of design using the computer to complete all projects. For second semester, a painting class, **Color**, **(KCPA 112)**, will be offered second semester. This is a painting course studying the properties and interactions of color and its resulting perceptual effects in pictorial space. Both classes are 3 college credit hours. Both classes meet the ELHS AP Studio Art **Color** class prerequisite requirement.

Students taking the class as a high school/ college credit will be required to have one less class during the school day, therefore a 5-class schedule. Students taking the class for college credit only, will need to maintain a regular 6-class schedule.

TIMES / LOCATION / CLASS SIZES

The fall class starts our first week back to school and go until winter break. The winter/spring class will run from Monday, January 9 until May 3. Both classes will meet in room 721 at East Lansing High School, *two days a week*, on Monday and Wednesday afternoon, from 3:00 until 6:10. Classes are limited to only10 students! This is an unheard of student to teacher ratio!

APPLICATION / ELIGIBILITY

Dual Enrollment is open to high school students who meet the following requirements:

- Successful completion of 2 high school visual art class OR digital media design related classes.
 If you have not completed two visual art classes at ELHS or have a recommendation from a high school art teacher, you will need to schedule a portfolio review. Portfolios, digital or actual, will be
- reviewed by Mrs. Remer-Saenz and are subject to review by a Kendall admissions representative.



Dear Parent/Guardian:

East Lansing High School has gone paperless by scheduling parent-teacher conferences online for conferences held on Tuesday, March 15th and Thursday March 17th. The scheduling window will opened to parents on Monday, February 22nd and will close on Friday, March 11th.

To schedule your preferred time for a parent-teacher conference:

- 1. Go to https://www.myconferencetime.com/elhs/.
- 2. Click on the name of your child's teacher.
- 3. Select the desired date/time for your conference by clicking on "Sign Up."
- 4. Submit the requested information. Make sure you leave at least 5 minutes in between conference times.

If you have several children attending our school, click on "Register for Multiple Conferences" and follow the prompts to schedule your children for several conferences.

After you schedule a conference online, the date and time are reserved for you. If you entered your email address correctly, you will receive email confirmation of your conference.

On the bottom of the page you will notice a gray task bar. Click on "Help me find conferences that I already scheduled." It will prompt you to enter your email address. Then you will notice in your inbox, a note from the company. If you open that email there will be a link. Click on the link and your schedule will appear in order of time and teacher.

If you are unable to sign up for a time and date online, you can come into the main office at the ELHS and use a computer to schedule your conferences or send a note with three preferred times and dates to your child's teacher. Once the teacher receives your note, he/she will attempt to schedule a conference for your desired date and time but cannot guarantee your top choices as time slots fill up quickly.
