Principal's Letter

February 15, 2017

Dear East Lansing Families,

I write to you today to let you know some of the good news the high school has received lately that underscores the quality education students receive within our walls.

- East Lansing High School was removed from the Focus School list in 2015-2016. This list was created in 2011 to identify schools with substantial achievement gaps among students. While we continue our work to further close gaps, removal from the Focus School list represents the progress we've made toward providing excellent service to all of our students.
- Our performance on state assessments has moved the high school from the 35th percentile of schools in 2013-2014 into the 90th percentile in 2015-2016.
- The high school was again named a US News & World Report Silver Medal School for the overall quality of education provided to students, placing us in the top 7% of all high schools nationwide.
- The Mackinac Center for Public Policy named ELHS a 2016 "A" school, placing our performance in the top 10% in the state. The Mackinac Center rates schools using a value-added measure, meaning that all students at ELHS progress at a substantially greater rate than would normally be expected.
- Bridge Magazine just named ELHS a 2017 Academic State Champion, placing us in the top 10% in the state for college preparedness.
- The College Board recently honored ELHS by placing us on their 7th Annual AP Honor Roll. Fewer than 500 schools nationwide made the list, which requires that schools substantially increase AP enrollments while maintaining excellent AP test results and high levels of service for traditionally underserved populations.

What I appreciate most about these honors is that they are for different things. I believe this indicates that the high does excellent work in many areas, not just a few. We always look to improve, but I am confident that our students are educated by a group of talented teachers who strive every day to provide a top-notch education to every individual in their classrooms.

Dear Parent/Guardian:

East Lansing High School has gone paperless by scheduling parent-teacher conferences online for conferences held on Tuesday, March 21st and Thursday, March 23rd. The scheduling window will opened to parents on Tuesday, February 21st by noon and will close on Friday, March 17th. *If you do not schedule by March 17th, please email the teacher for a date and time.*

To schedule your preferred time for a parent-teacher conference:

- 1. Go to https://www.myconferencetime.com/elhs/.
- 2. Click on the name of your child's teacher.
- 3. Select the desired date/time for your conference by clicking on "Sign Up."
- 4. Submit the requested information. Make sure you leave at least 5 minutes in between conference times.

If you have several children attending our school, click on "Register for Multiple Conferences" and follow the prompts to schedule your children for several conferences.

After you schedule a conference online, the date and time are reserved for you. If you entered your email address correctly, you will receive email confirmation of your conference.

On the bottom of the page you will notice a gray task bar. Click on "Help me find conferences that I already scheduled." It will prompt you to enter your email address. Then you will notice in your inbox, a note from the company. If you open that email there will be a link. Click on the link and your schedule will appear in order of time and teacher.

If you are unable to sign up for a time and date online, you can come into the main office at the ELHS and use a computer to schedule your conferences or send a note with three preferred times and dates to your child's teacher. Once the teacher receives your note, he/she will attempt to schedule a conference for your desired date and time but cannot guarantee your top choices as time slots fill up quickly.

ELHS STUDENTS CAN GET A HEAD START ON COLLEGE BY TAKING A KENDALL COLLEGE of ART & DESIGN CLASS, RIGHT HERE AT ELHS!

East Lansing High School students have a unique opportunity to take prestigious Kendall College of Art and Design class here at our own school, through our Dual Enrollment partnership with KCAD. Students will earn 3 college credits on successful completion of the class, without a rigorous exam.

This is a great way for motivated students, who are strong in art, to get a jump on college classes or take an advanced art class while avoiding scheduling problems. During the 2017-2018 year, Mrs. Remer-Saenz, will be offering two Kendall College of Art and Design classes. During first semester we will be offering, **Design and Color, (KCGD 113)**, which is a computer based graphic design/digital media class. This class is an introduction to the visual and verbal vocabularies of design and color theory as they relate to graphic design. The class will focus on the elements and principals of design using the computer to complete all projects. For second semester, a painting class, **Color**, **(KCPA 112)**, will be offered second semester. This is a painting course studying the properties and interactions of color and its resulting perceptual effects in pictorial space. Both classes are 3 college credit hours. Both classes meet the ELHS AP Studio Art *Color* class prerequisite requirement. **Students taking the class as a high school/ college credit will be required to have one less class during the school day**, therefore a 5-class schedule. Students taking the class for college credit only, will need to maintain a regular 6-class schedule.

TIMES / LOCATION / CLASS SIZES

The fall class starts our first week back to school and ends just before winter break. The winter/spring class will run from Monday, January 8 and run until the second week of May. Both classes will meet in room 721 at East Lansing High School, *two days a week*, on Monday and Wednesday afternoon, from 2:45 until 6:00.

Classes are limited to only10 students! This is an unheard of student to teacher ratio!

APPLICATION / ELIGIBILITY

Dual Enrollment is open to high school students who meet the following requirements:


- Successful completion of 2 high school visual art class OR digital media design related classes.
- If you have not completed two visual art classes at ELHS or have a recommendation from a high school art teacher, you may need to schedule a portfolio review. Portfolios, digital or actual, will be reviewed by Mrs. Remer-Saenz and are subject to review by a Kendall admissions representative.

Please let your High School counselor and Mrs. Remer-Saenz know that you are interested in one of these dual enrollment class by speaking with them directly or sending an e-mail to Mrs. Remer-Saenz at: Robin.remersaenz@elps.us, preferably by March, while schedules are still easy to adjust. All interested students must be enrolled in the fall, Design & Color class by the end of drops and adds this spring. The second semester Color class will remain an open enrollment until late October.
