Principal's Letter



Dear East Lansing Families,

Welcome back! I hope you each enjoyed the winter break and special time with family and friends. We have returned to our normal school routines and are gearing up for first semester final exams, which will be administered January 24-26. The end of the first marking period is a busy and stressful time, so please continue to support your student's wellbeing by encouraging him/her to get appropriate rest and nutrition during the testing period.

In February we will begin the course selection and scheduling process for the 2018-19 school year. School counselors will provide students with new course information and the opportunity to participate in preliminary course selection. As we move through the process, we will engage in dialogue with staff members to determine the parameters which will guide scheduling. Our goal is to complete various phases of the process in a timely manner to allow for necessary adjustments prior completing the final version of the master schedule. As we move forward in the process, we will keep you informed so that you can engage in a conversation with your student about their course preferences for next school year.

East Lansing High School will once again participate in the Michigan Profile for Healthy Youth survey (MiPHY). The survey is supported by the Michigan Departments of Education and Health and Human Services. The survey consists of a number of questions that ask about the health and behaviors of 9th and 11th grade students, and will focus on behaviors and attitudes related to nutrition, physical activity, injuries, tobacco, alcohol, and other drug use. It will also ask about sexual behaviors that lead to pregnancy, AIDS and other sexually transmitted diseases. The survey will be presented in an online format and students will have the opportunity to complete the survey at a private computer terminal in order to protect each student's privacy. Please note: the survey is voluntary and students will not be asked to provide their name or any other identifying information.

A point of celebration: Our Positive Behavior Support Program had a successful first semester. Trojan TURF has identified over 200 students displaying Trust, Unity, Respect, or Fairness in and around the school. Students have won prizes such as gift cards to local businesses. These referrals have been sent home in the mail to share the positive behaviors with parents.

Student Services

Drops and Adds – Spring Semester

Please have your students log on to Powerschool to take a look at their 2nd semester schedules. 2nd semester drops/adds will occur in Student Services on Wednesday, January 24th and Thursday, January 25th from school dismissal until 12:30pm in student services. Students can pick up the drop/add form in student services and will need a parent signature to approve any core class change. Many 2nd semester classes are full, so the counselors may not be able to accommodate a student's request due to the class numbers.

PSAT Information

The PSAT scores for the test date that some of our student's elected to take in October are now available. Students may pick up their score reports in student services. Students will also need to make an account at www.collegeboard.org. ELHS also does not have the ability to troubleshoot College Board account issues. Students will need to contact College Board if they need help setting up their account or accessing their scores.

Scheduling Information for 2018-2019 School Year Counselors will be hosting grade level assemblies during excels to hand out registration information. Juniors – Tuesday, February 6th, Sophomores – Thursday, February 8th, and Freshman – February 13th.

Students will meet with their counselors to request their courses for the 2018-2019 school year. Appointment times will be posted outside of student services starting on February 5th. Juniors will schedule February 21st, 22nd, and 23rd. Sophomores will schedule February 27th, 28th, and March 1st and 2nd. Freshman will schedule March 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th.

We will be hosting a *Junior Parent Night* on *Thursday, February 8th at 7pm in the Student Union*. At this presentation, we will be going over what junior parents need to expect as their children move towards their senior year in high school. Topics such as graduation, college applications, NCAA clearinghouse, etc will be covered. We are still working out the details of how scheduling will work for the 8th graders. We will share those details in the next issue of Parentline for those of you that may have a current 8th grader.

Dual Enrollment and Online Grades – Fall Semester Students are required to turn in grade reports if they took a fall dual enrollment or online class. These grade reports need to be turned in to student services so that the registrar can place them on a student's transcript.

Seventh Semester Transcripts

Seventh semester transcripts will be available for students in the graduating class of 2018 at the end of January. Many colleges will request 7th semester transcripts from our students.

Direct to College - Students may request their 7th semester transcripts through parchment.com at any time. Transcripts will be sent out as soon as they are finalized.

Common App – If the original application was submitted through common app, counselors will automatically send out a 7th semester transcript once the transcripts are finalized.

Attendance Policy



Student Absences

There are two types of absences: excused and unexcused. Excused absences include: illness, observance of a religious holiday, death in the immediate family, family emergency, situations beyond the control of the student, circumstances that cause reasonable concern to the parent/guardian for the student's safety or health, or other reason as approved by the principal. All other absences are considered unexcused. Pre-arranged excused absences must be approved by the principal.

The school may require documentation explaining the reason for the student's absence.

In the event of any absence, the student's parent or guardian is required to call the school at 517-333-7567 to explain the reason for the absence within 48 hours of the absence. Failure to do so shall result in an unexcused absence.

*To earn credit in a course, absences must not exceed nine (9) total absences (excused and unexcused) in each class per semester. A student with 10 or more absences who earned a passing grade in a course and scored a minimum 78% on a comprehensive final exam for the course will receive credit. Any student not meeting this requirement will need to follow the appeal process in order to receive credit.

*ALL absences will count toward the allowable limit with the exemption of school related absences, religious observances and extended medical absences. There is no distinction made between an excused or unexcused absence (except for purposes of providing make-up work).

*Without an excused note, 10 minutes tardy is counted as an absence in class. Three tardies to class equals one absence.

APPEAL PROCESS

Students may appeal the withholding of credit due to excessive absences by completing the attendance appeal form.

At the time of the appeal, the student's attendance file will be reviewed. The high school administration will examine the following documentation provided by the parents:

*Religious observations *Funerals *Doctor/dental appointments *Court dates *Recurring illness/extended illness

The Mask You Live In


East Lansing High School hosts free public screening of "The Mask You Live In."

Please join East Lansing parents, community members, staff, and middle to high school students to screen award winning film "The Mask You Live In," a film that follows boys and young men as they struggle to stay true to themselves while negotiating America's narrow definition of masculinity. This is a follow-up film to "Miss Representation," which was previously screened at the Middle School and tells the story of how the media is selling the idea that girls' and women's value lies in their youth, beauty, and sexuality and not in their capacity as leaders.

"The Mask You Live In" showcases how males, feeling pressured by the media, their peer group, and even the adults in their lives, confront messages encouraging them to disconnect from their emotions, devalue authentic friendships, objectify and degrade women, and resolve conflicts through violence. These gender stereotypes interconnect with race, class, and circumstance, creating a maze of identity issues boys and young men must navigate to become "real" men.

Experts in neuroscience, psychology, sociology, sports, education, and media also weigh in, offering empirical evidence of the "boy crisis" and tactics to combat it.

The Mask You Live In ultimately illustrates how we, as a society, can raise a healthier generation of boys and young men.



Immediately following the screening, a panel of local experts and community members will weigh in during a Q&A session.

Additionally, Students for Gender Equality and several ELHS faculty and staff members will be hosting 5 dialogue sessions during their EXCEL class periods for HS students during the months of February and March and plan to structure them based on the curriculum provided by "The Mask You Live In." 
