Principal's Letter



Greetings ELHS family!

It's hard to believe we've completed the first marking period and Thanksgiving is almost here! Our students' academic, social, and emotional growth remains our collective focus as they continue their journey through the most formidable years in their maturation process.

I want to convey my heartfelt gratitude for the support we continue to receive from our parents and community. Our students' success is a byproduct of your support, and it is that success along with your ongoing efforts that allows our continued recognition as a distinguished school.

The staff at East Lansing High School remains steadfast in providing instruction that will embrace our students' imagination, critical thinking, and passion for learning. These exceptional learning experiences provide a platform for students to engage in meaningful discussion while encouraging us all to think deeply about subject matter and the world around us. Thank you, ELHS staff, for your commitment to providing sound educational experiences for all students and for supporting the values that represent a strong, vibrant learning community.

On October 25, the ELHS and MacDonald Middle School orchestras combined for an outstanding performance. Our students dazzled the audience with a variety of musical pieces including a piece written by former East Lansing Public School teacher and guest performer, Rodney Page.

On October 30, we recognized 359 students at the Dedicated and Distinguished Scholar Award ceremony. The awardees were recognized for achieving a grade point average of 3.7 or above in the first or second semester during the 2016-17 school year. Students who improved their grade point by at least .5 during the 2015-16 or the 2016-17 school year were also recognized. Congratulations to the recipients! What an awesome accomplishment!

Trojan TURF is the high school's positive behavior support program. TURF stands for Trust, Unity, Respect, and Fairness. Through positive referrals presented to the office, staff members identified students exhibiting these qualities. So far in this school year, more than 100 students have been positively referred to the office. Of these students, 32 have been randomly selected for various prizes (gift cards, tickets to dances/sporting events, treats). Once recorded and raffled, the prizes are mailed home to parents to share the good news about their student's behavior. This year, the Trojan TURF has also been identifying and rewarding students who make it to class on time. In September we recognized over 650 students without a tardy recorded in Power School. For October, we recognized over 600 students without a tardy in Power School.

Lastly, I would like to recognize our students who participated in fall athletics and other extracurricular activities. They have achieved many awards including championships in football, boys' soccer, and water polo. Their competitiveness earned district, regional and statewide recognition. We are so proud of our students, coaches, and advisors for continuing the wonderful East Lansing High School tradition. Way to go ELHS family!

Student Services

Admissions Decisions

Many universities will be releasing admissions decisions to students over the holiday break. In many cases, students will receive an offer of admission which should be a cause for celebration.

In other cases, students may receive notification that the decision has been deferred and that the University would like to see grades from the 7th semester. If your student gets this notification.... **it is not a cause for panic**. The University is simply interested in taking into consideration the student's 1st semester senior grades as part of their admissions decision process. This is a very common practice as Universities are making sure that they accept students that are a good fit for their incoming student body.

Students may also receive a letter from the University of their dreams that does not offer up admission. Often times this news does not settle well with our teens, especially when all of their envisioned future plans have them strolling through that campus this fall. We would like to encourage families that have this happen in their home to remind their students that a denial from this particular University does not mean they have less of a chance of living a happy life. This is a wonderful opportunity for them to build a great life at another school. Plan B (or C, or D, or E) can bring just as many great opportunities as what they hoped Plan A would bring.

Dual Enrolled Students – 1st Semester

Once you have completed your dual enrolled course, you are responsible for turning in a copy of your final grade to Mrs. Bledsoe, ELHS registrar.

Dual Enrolled Students – 2nd Semester

It is your responsibility to make sure that we have the correct course on your paperwork that you end up taking. If you change your mind and don't let us know, your family will receive a bill for the full amount of tuition for the course.

FAFSA -NEW THIS YEAR

The FAFSA is now open for the graduating class of 2018 to fill out. The FAFSA determines the amount of financial aid (loans, grants, scholarships, etc) that your student may be eligible for. The deadline for Michigan students to receive optimal consideration is March 1st, 2018..... but don't wait until then.

Seventh Semester Transcripts

Seventh semester transcripts will be available for students in the graduating class of 2018 at the end of January. Many colleges will request 7th semester transcripts from our students. After winter break, students may request their 7th semester transcripts through parchment.com for non-common app schools.

Counseling Appointments

Making an appointment with a counselor just got a little bit easier! Appointments can also be made by emailing your counselor or by stopping in and making an appointment in student services.

Testing

In April, all 9th and 10th grade students will take the PSAT, and all 11th grade students will take the SAT. While these are state mandated tests.... they do allow our 9th/10th to experience a standardized testing situation before taking the SAT. The 11th grade SAT state mandated test allows all students to have a college reportable score, which can open up the college door for our students.

College Board Account

Students should make themselves a student account at the www.collegeboard.com (SAT/PSAT). This is where they will manage their test results, have access to test prep, and have access to career and college exploration. The college/career exploration features are top notch... and can be very helpful for students trying to figure out where their next journey will take them.

Free SAT Test Prep

Khan Academy offers free SAT test prep/practice for all students. Visit satpractice.org/k12 to get your students started. The great thing about Khan is that you can link your Khan account with your College Board account. This helps with test prep!

College Visits

Information Verification


