Dear East Lansing Families,

It looks like winter has finally gone and spring has sprung! Winter sports are wrapping up with swimming and gymnastics being represented at States this week. Individual wrestlers placed well at States last week. Girls' basketball ended in a three-way tie for CACC Blue Division conference. Spring sports are in full gear this week, with excited participants and anticipation for successful seasons.

The Theater Department will be presenting their spring musical "The Wiz" March 20th-22nd, 25th, and 27th-29th. The Fine Arts Department has some outstanding accomplishments I would like to recognize. In Visual Arts, one student won the prestigious Scholastic Art Gold KEY Award from Kendall College of Art and Design of Ferris State University. Another won an award from the MSU Federal Credit Union art show, and her work is on display on an I-96 billboard. In Performing Arts, the East Lansing bands are hosting the US Army Field Band and Chorus on March 25th, and David Rosin has been named the 2015 MSBOA Orchestra Teacher of the Year. Fine Arts activities will increase as the end of the year approaches and I hope to see you at their many events.

Registration for the 2015-16 school year is almost complete. Once the course request tallies are compiled, a master schedule for next year will be developed and student schedules will be created. The plan is to distribute schedules before the end of the school year.

For the first time, spring parent/teacher conferences were scheduled using an on-line method. We have heard mostly positive comments about this method, and will likely continue its use in the fall. It has been praised by parents as being quick, user friendly and convenient. The only negative comment was that some found they booked their appointment times too close and couldn't move from one end of the building to the other in time.

ELHS is a busy place this time of year, and sometimes we need to remind students of our dress code and appropriate behavior. Ninth and tenth graders have a closed campus – they are not to leave the building during the school day unless permission has been received from the parent. It's very tempting for them to run to nearby food establishments. However, for safety reasons they need to remain on campus. Open campus is permitted for juniors and seniors during their lunch time, but not during Excel. We remind students to use Excel appropriately and attend one of their classes.

With warmer weather here, I need your assistance in reminding your child to dress for school, not the beach. We have a rather liberal dress code – asking that the trunk of the body be covered, no hats/hoods except for religious reasons, and no inappropriate messages or symbols on clothing. Students violating these guidelines will be required to change attire. I don't particularly enjoy being the "dress code police", but we need to keep our learning environment productive and comfortable for all.

I'm anticipating the last quarter of this school year will go by quickly, and soon our hallways will be quiet. Have no fear, the summer will pass just as quickly!

I'll end on this quote from Anne Frank, "Parents can only give good advice or put them on the right path, the final forming of a person's character lies in their own hands."



Scheduling

Student course requests for the 2015 – 2016 school year have now been gathered from all of the ELHS 9th – 11th graders, and MMS 8th graders. We are starting the task of working on building the master schedule based on what the students are telling us they would like to take. Students should expect to receive their schedules during the last week of classes in June. Drops/Adds will take place during that week.

Seventh Semester Transcripts Seventh semester transcripts are available for students in the graduating class of 2015 at the end of January. Many colleges will request 7th semester transcripts from our students.

- Direct to College Students may request their 7th semester transcripts through parchment.com at any time, but in order to process this request, Student Services staff must receive a completed router form from the student. If the student would like a hard-copy transcript sent to a college/university, the office will need a stamped, addressed envelope to process this request.
- Common App If the original application was submitted through common app, a router form needs to be filled out and submitted to student services. This lets your counselor know to attach your 7th semester transcript to your common app.

If you received instructions from your advocate to report to a different room on test days, please do so.

If you arrive at the testing location after testing has started, you will **not** be admitted to the testing room.

Use of cell phones and electronic devices is strictly prohibited. Do not bring them with you to the testing environment. Leave your phone in a safe place during testing.

WHAT TO BRING

Two soft-lead No. 2 pencils with good erasers
 (Use of pens, colored pencils, or highlighters is **not** permitted.)

• Acceptable photo ID – must meet **all** of the following criteria:

Examples: driver's license, passport, school ID

- Current (**not** expired)
- Includes your first and last names
- Issued by school, employer, or government agency
- Current photo clearly recognizable
- A calculator for mathematics assessments only (optional)

If you use a calculator, be sure to bring a calculator that you are comfortable using, along with fresh batteries. Check the Prohibited Calculator List at www.act.org to make sure that your calculator is permitted for use on the MME mathematics tests.

A watch (if you wish to pace yourself)

Alarms must be turned off.

WHAT NOT TO BRING

Do **not** bring the following items to the test room:

• Cell phone, pager, iPod, timer, or other digital/electronic equipment

Use of any device to share or exchange information at any time during testing or during the breaks is a prohibited behavior. If you bring any of these devices to the test room, you will be required to turn the device off and leave it with the Room Supervisor until you are dismissed after testing concludes.

- Scratch paper, notes, foreign language or other dictionary (unless used as an approved accommodation). You may do scratch work in your Test Booklet
- Pens, colored pencils, or highlighters
- Portable listening or recording device
- Camera or other photographic equipment

TIPS TO DO YOUR BEST

- Be well rested. Get a good night's sleep the night before each test.
- Eat a healthy breakfast each morning.
- Make sure you have your picture ID, pencils, and calculator (if you are using one).
- Arrive on time. Students will **not** be admitted to the testing room once the Test Booklets have been distributed.
- If you are testing at an unfamiliar location, make sure you have directions.
- Pace yourself during the test. If you find yourself spending too much time on one question, move on to the next question.
- Use breaks to eat or drink any snacks you may have brought with you. No food or drink is allowed in the testing room unless preauthorized due to a medical necessity.
