2nd Semester Forms

All forms for alternative schedules (dual enrollment, virtual learning classes, etc) for 2nd semester need to be received by Student Services no later than December 5th.

College Application Deadline

The deadline for college applications with a December deadline or January 15th deadline must be turned in no later than Friday, December 5th to Student Services. The counseling staff needs time to process the applications before winter break. Thank you for your cooperation.

Seventh Semester Transcripts

Seventh semester transcripts will be available for students in the graduating class of 2015 at the end of January. Many colleges will request 7th semester transcripts from our students. After winter break, a 7th Semester Router Form will be available in Student Services. Students may request their 7th semester transcripts through parchment.com at any time, but in order to process this request, Student Services staff must receive a completed router form from the student. If the student would like a hard-copy transcript sent to a college/university, the office will need a \$3 along with a stamped, addressed envelope to process this request.

Tutoring and Academic Support

Tutoring and Academic Support is now available in the ELHS media center. The after school program runs M, W, and Th from 2:45 pm to 4:00 pm. This program is staffed with volunteers from Michigan State University, ELHS students, parent volunteers, and the ELHS counselors.

Because every student needs to succeed in completing graduation requirements, academic support is offered to any student who may be struggling in a particular class or who may need a quiet supervised setting for homework. Computers with Internet access and printers are available in the library media center for student use. Students are required to sign in and a quiet atmosphere is expected. More information about tutoring and a calendar of available tutoring dates can be found at the ELHS Student Services web page, under the curriculum tab.

Counselor Appointments

Getting in to see your counselor is very easy here at East Lansing High School. Students just need to stop into student services to make an appointment.

Still Pursue those scholarships

Scholarships are still out there and waiting for your application. There are no limits to the amount of money you can earn from scholarships and the price of an education is on the rise. Scholarships are available in many areas so despite what grade you are in or what your strengths

AMC 10/12

About AMC 10/12

The AMC 10 is a 25-question, 75-minute, multiple choice examination in secondary school mathematics containing problems which can be understood and solved with algebra and geometry concepts. The AMC 12 is a 25-question, 75-minute, multiple choice examination in secondary school mathematics containing problems which can be understood and solved with pre-calculus concepts. Two different versions of the contests are given on two dates, about two weeks apart, in February. Each AMC 10 and AMC 12 contest contain about 12 of the same math problems.

Purpose of the AMC 10/12

The main purpose of the AMC 10/12 is to spur interest in mathematics and to develop talent through the excitement of solving challenging problems in a timed multiple-choice format. The problems range from the very easy to the extremely difficult. Students who participate in the AMC 10/12 should find that most of the problems are challenging but within their grasp. The contest is intended for everyone from the average student at a typical school who enjoys mathematics to the very best student at the most special school.

A special purpose of the AMC 10/12 is to help identify those few students with truly exceptional mathematics talent. Students who are among the very best deserve some indication of how they stand relative to other students in the country and around the world. The AMC 10/12 provides one such indication, and it is the first in a series of examinations. The AMC 12 is one in a series of examinations (followed in the United States by the American Invitational Examination and the USA Mathematical Olympiad) that culminate in participation in the International Mathematical Olympiad, the most prestigious and difficult secondary mathematics examination in the world. In this way the very best young mathematicians are recognized, encouraged and developed. Another valuable comparison students can make is between their own level of achievement and their levels in previous years. In particular, they are encouraged to begin taking the contests early in their mathematics studies and to look back with pride each year on how they have learned to answer questions that they could not have answered previously.

Intramural Awards

- A Certificate of Distinction is given to all students who qualify to take the American Invitational Mathematics Examination.
- An AMC 10 and AMC 12 Winner Pin (or medal, as appropriate) is given to the student(s) in each school with the highest score.
- An AMC 10 and AMC 12 Honor Roll of Distinction Pin is given to the top 1% of all participating students.
- An AMC 12 Certificate of Achievement is given to high scoring students who are in 10th grade or below.
- An AMC 10 Certificate of Achievement is given to high scoring students who are in 8th grade or below.

Which Test Should You Take?

We encourage all students in grades 9 and 10 to participate in the AMC 10. All USA, USA embassy, Canadian, and foreign school students in grade 10 or below are eligible to participate as long as they are under 17.5 years of age on the day of the contest.

We encourage all students in grades 11 and 12 to participate in the AMC 12. All USA, USA embassy, Canadian, and foreign school students in grade 12 or below are eligible to participate as long as they are under 19.5 years of age on the day of the contest.


