

News from Student Services

College Connection- On Monday, September 8th Senior Parent night was held by the student services staff in the Student Union. On Tuesday, September 9th the counselors also met with the Class of 2015 in the Student Union. The college application process, financial aid, testing, and graduation requirements were discussed. We have included important documents from these meetings in this edition of Parentline.

Direct to College Applications (ex. MSU, CMU, WMU, LCC) - Students need to visit college websites and start filling out their application online. Once a student is ready for ELHS to send his/her transcript, he/she must request the transcript sent through parchment (online transcript service), and then fill out a router form and submit to student services. Once the router form is received, student services will complete the final steps needed for parchment to deliver the transcript to the college/ university.

Common Application - Students need to visit www.commonapp. org to start their college applications. Common app has a listing of all of the participating colleges on the main page of their website. A piece of the required common app will require that the student list his/her counselor. Once filled out, this generates an e-mail to his/her counselor that gives the counselor access to the application to fill out the recommendation and transcript. Once a student is ready for his/her counselor to fill out the recommendation page and send his/her transcript to common app, fill out a router form and submit to student services. Once received,

the student's counselor will be able to complete their portion of the common app.

ACT/SAT Scores – Students must send their scores directly from ACT/SAT to the college/university that they are applying to. For ACT...visit www.actstudent.org. For SAT... visit www.college-board.com.

Letters of Recommendation -

When a student asks for a letter of recommendation to be written on his/her behalf, it is always wise for the student to have a resume or activities page handy to give to the recommender. This allows the person writing the letter to incorporate the students other activities into the letter of recommendation.

Scholarships – A great resource for available scholarships is the scholarship area at the East Lansing High School Student Services page. Every opportunity the Student Services office receives is placed in this area for students to view. It is worth checking out!

FAFSA - The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) for the Class of 2015 is based on a family's wages from 2014. Student Services will be hosting financial aid workshops to help families understand the FAFSA and financial aid after the New Year. Stay tuned!

Schedule Changes - Schedule changes for the fall semester are now done. The only reason for a schedule change at this point is a catastrophic error in the schedule, or if a student needs a course to graduate in the spring.

Counseling Appointments - Students and parents wishing to make an appointment with the counselors just needs to stop by or call Student Services (517-333-7505) to arrange a time and date that works.

If you would still like a packet from the Senior Parent Night, they are available in the Student Services Office.




