TESTING Spring 2024 April 9th, 10th, and 11th

All 9th and 10th grade students will take the PSAT and all 11th grade students will take the MME which includes the SAT, M-Step, and WorkKeys.

These are state mandated tests and will allow our 9th and 10th grade students an opportunity to experience a standardized testing situation before taking the SAT.

The 11th grade SAT state mandated test allows all students to have a college reportable score.

SAT PREP

Khan Academy offers free SAT test prep/practice for all students. Visit <u>satpractice.org/k12</u> to get your student started. The great thing about Khan is that you can link your Khan account with your College Board account. This helps with test prep!

COLLEGE BOARD

Students should make themselves a student account at <u>www.collegboard.com</u> (SAT/PSAT). This is where they will manage their test results, have access to test prep, and have access to career and college exploration. The college/career exploration features are top notch...and can be very helpful for students trying to figure out where their next journey will take them.

If they have already made a college board account, DO NOT make a new one. Also, DO NOT make an account as a parent/guardian. We need to track the email back to the student, Thank You!



OFFICE FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID

The Office for Federal Student Aid has announced that the opening date for the 2024-2025 FAFSA will be December 31st, 2023. It is highly recommended for all families of seniors to fill out this form, regardless of anticipated aid or current postgraduation plans. Given that this is a brand new version of FAFSA, I am anticipating that there may still be technical difficulties with the form when it first opens, so I am recommending that families who run into issues fill out the FAFSA in mid-January, when the system is running more smoothly. Feel free to review the changes to the 2024-2025 FAFSA here: https://finaid.umich.edu/2024-2025-fafsachanges. In the meantime, both students and any contributors (parents, step-parents, guardians, etc.) will need to create an FSA ID in order to fill out FAFSA.
