THE CURRICULUM

The curriculum provides over 165 core courses in academics, fine arts and the applied arts, plus opportunities at vocational centers. More than 80% of our students participate in a wide variety of extra-curricular activities. The school supports 54 athletic teams and over 30 special interest clubs, including a chapter of the National Honor Society. Dual credit may be earned at Michigan Colleges and Universities. Students can earn additional credit online through Michigan Virtual and through gifted and talented programs at Michigan State University.

GRADING FRAMEWORK

East Lansing High School assigns letter grades using a 4.0 system.

Advanced Placement courses are weighted by 10% for any student who passes the AP course.

East Lansing High School does not report class rank.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Advanced Placement courses are offered in Calculus AB, Calculus BC, English Literature and Composition, English Language and Composition, Chemistry, Physics, Biology, Environmental Science, American History, European History, World History, Government, Psychology, Economics, Statistics, French, Studio Art, Computer Science, and Spanish.
