## SURVEY FOR 7<sup>TH</sup> GRADERS

The East Lansing School District is taking part in the Michigan Profile for Healthy Youth survey, MiPHY, supported by the Michigan Departments of Education and Health and Human Services. The research survey will ask about the health behaviors of 7th, 9th, and 11th grade students. The survey will ask about behavior and attitude related to nutrition, physical activity, injuries, tobacco, alcohol, and other drug use. It will also ask about sexual behaviors that cause AIDS, other sexually transmitted diseases, and pregnancy. The survey will take place at the Middle School on Friday, **February 2** during 7<sup>th</sup> grade social studies.

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As a part of reading Anne Frank and learning about genocide, all 8th grade English classes visited the Holocaust

Memorial Center in Farmington Hills. The mission of the center is to remember those who perished and survived the Holocaust, and to teach lessons about the past to ensure that they do not get repeated in the future. Students experienced a tour of the center, learning about the history and culture of the Jewish people and the atrocities of the Holocaust. Some highlights of the tour included seeing a real WW-II era boxcar and a sapling from the chestnut tree that grew outside of Anne Frank's window in her hiding place in Amsterdam. Then, students had the unique opportunity to listen to a Holocaust survivor speak and share their



experience. This valuable learning opportunity was made possible through a parent council grant and generous parent donations.
