Each year a free and reduced application must be completed. If your student is approved for free or reduced meals, the benefits are applied immediately for breakfast and lunch each day for one school year. <u>Prior to your</u> student's approval, parents and or guardians are responsible for payment of meals until the application has been approved.

How do I apply for Free or Reduced Lunch?

All buildings have applications available that can be picked up and filled out at any time. You can also apply online at the website <u>www.LunchApp.com</u>. Your application will be processed once it reaches our office at the high school kitchen. You will receive an e-mail when completed. In addition, we mail out approval letters once a week to parents who do not have e-mails.

Where are the Menus?

Menus are located at <u>elps.nutrislice.com</u>. Also, menus are posted in the cafeterias and are sent home once a month with all elementary students.

Is Breakfast available and at what time?

Breakfast is serve 20-30 minutes prior to school starting on all half and full days except for late start dates. The location is in the cafeteria at each building. In addition, a breakfast vending machine is available on the first floor at the high school. The options are hot and cold breakfasts including a fruit and or juice with a milk. Breakfast prices are 1.60 for Elementary, 1.85 for Middle School and High School, Reduced price .30, and Free to qualified students.

How can I pay for my student's account?

Cash and checks can be brought to the cafeteria during meal periods or at the front office of any of the schools. Deposits are put into the student's account each day at 9:15 am. Payments dropped off after 9:15 am will be deposited the follow day. Payments can be made at any time online and are processed within the hour at <u>www.SendMoneyToSchool.com</u>. There is a \$2.25 transaction fee for this service. In addition, you can mail checks to East Lansing High School, Attn. Food Service Dept., 509 Burcham Dr., East Lansing, MI 48823

How do I know the balance of my student's account?

If your email is up to date in the school system, you should receive emails every day once your student's account is a <u>positive \$5.00 or below</u>. Also, parents can always view their student's meal account anytime for **FREE** at <u>www.SendMoneyToSchool.com</u>. This is a <u>free account</u> that allows parents to access their student's lunch account. Once you are on the website it will prompt you to make your own account. You will need your student's ID number that will link your home account to theirs. On this website you can see what they are buying, when their account is charged, set blocks and limits to their spending, check their balance and deposit money.

What is the School District's Meal Charge Policy?

ELEMENTARY

Students are able to charge until <u>-10.00 balance on their account</u>. If a student does not have adequate funds and has reached the charge limit, they will be provided a cheese sandwich with fruit, vegetable and a choice of milk. Money can be deposited into student's accounts by putting money in an envelope with the child's name and depositing at their school or by setting up an account at <u>Sendmoneytoschool.com</u>. In addition, parents can send a check or money order to East Lansing High School, 509 Burcham Dr., Attn. Food Service Dept., East Lansing, MI, 48823. All parents who have supplied an e-mail will receive a low balance notice daily when their student reaches \$5.00 positive balance and under. In addition, a low balance notice will be sent home weekly in Friday folders to all students who have a \$5.00 positive and under balance. MIDDLE & HIGH SCHOOL

Students are able to charge <u>two meals</u> on their account. If a student has a 0 balance or below they will <u>not</u> be allowed to charge ala carte items. In addition, if a student does not have adequate funds and has reached the charge limit, they will be provided a cheese sandwich with fruit, vegetable and a choice of milk. Money can be deposited into student's accounts during meal times or by setting up an account at <u>Sendmoneytoschool.com</u>. Also, parents can send a check or money order to East Lansing High School, 509 Burcham Dr., Attn. Food Service Dept., East Lansing, MI, 48823. All parents who have supplied an e-mail will receive a low balance notice daily when their student reaches \$5.00 positive and under balance. Will my student be denied a meal? What if their account is negative?

No, your student will never be denied a meal. Our cashiers at the middle school and high school are trained to inform your child when their account is negative. We will let them buy a reimbursable meal for 2 days, not snack items, with a negative balance. If your student's balance has not been paid in full after the 2 charge limit, we will offer a free alternative meal. This will consist of a cheese sandwich, fruit of their choice, vegetable of their choice, and an 80z milk.

What does a Lunch include?

Lunch includes a main entrée, a fruit, a vegetable, a wholegrain source and a milk. Students will need to take at least 3 from the 5 food groups offered and 1 of those options will need to be a fruit and/or vegetable. If your student would like to purchase only a milk, a second entrée, or any extra items in addition to their meal, they will be charged full price as posted in the cafeteria.

If my student has a food allergy, can you accommodate for their needs?

Before we can make any substitutions or accommodate to any allergy or diets, we need to have a copy of the Michigan Department of Education Allergy Form completed by your doctor.
