#### SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL

Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is an international movement—and now a federal program—to make it safe, convenient, and fun for children, including those with disabilities, to bicycle and walk to school. When routes are safe, walking or biking to and from school is an easy way to get the regular physical activity children need for good health. Safe Routes to School initiatives also help ease traffic jams and air pollution, unite neighborhoods, and contribute to students' readiness to learn in school.

To this effect, the East Lansing SRTS team is working to improve the area surrounding MacDonald Middle School. Students may remember the SRTS team coming in and giving pedestrian and bicycling safety presentations at the beginning of the school year. We are currently partnering with the Michigan Fitness Foundation (MFF) to learn parent's and children's thoughts about children walking and biking to school. To compile this data, MFF has created a survey for parents and students to complete and will only take 5-10 minutes. The student survey is being administered while your child is at school.

For the parent survey, we ask that each family complete only one survey per school their children attend. If more than one child attends the same school, we ask that parents fill out the survey for the child with the next birthday from today's date.

This survey, along with other information collected by the SRTS team, will be taken into consideration during the development of East Lansing's SRTS action plan. The major infrastructure grant is worth \$200,000 per school that we are awarded. Therefore, this information is extremely helpful in our efforts to obtain this grant for MacDonald Middle School.
