Collection Dates: Monday, March 1 until (We get enough stuff!)

For: Mr. Voigt's Design and Build class use (6th grade)

Take-Apart Week is sponsored by Mr. Voigt's Design and Build class and is a 6th grade activity. However, it is hoped that all MacDonald families might help out by contributing items that will be useful to the activity.

During Take-Apart Week students explore how to use tools to take apart appliances and investigate how machines work through the process of reverse engineering. Most students enjoy this experience and gain not only a sense of how various machines work, but also develop a sense of confidence about their understanding of technology and their control over it. Students are instructed in the safe use of hand tools and then guided through the Take-Apart activity where they disassemble various appliances. In teams the children may also participate in the process of creating a new invention using parts from the item they have taken apart.

To make the Take-Apart Week a success, we need your help by collecting take-apart machines, toys, and the like. These items are important as they help children design their creations. Please take a look at the Lists below for Take-Apart type items. Also note that the list below specifies whether an item is acceptable or unacceptable.

We hope you will consider looking around your home or office for items to contribute. A Collection Center will be set up just inside the cafeteria where you may deposit your items any time school is open.
