This year again, **MacDonald will be supporting the Trick or Treat for UNICEF effort.** This program introduces students to the needs of other children around the world suffering from the disastrous effects of hurricanes and floods, civil conflicts, raging forest fires, malnutrition and uncontrolled disease.

UNICEF stands for United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund and was begun by the United Nations to take care of children affected by World War II. Today UNICEF is still helping children in more than 100 countries in every part of the world. By supporting UNICEF, we are able to provide an opportunity for our students to understand more of the world around them and gain some empathy for others through participation in a good cause.

Your child will have the option to use the traditional orange Trick or Treat box to collect funds while trick or treating this year. Students will also be sponsoring a UNICEF Bake Sale during lunch on Halloween day, October 31. All proceeds to be given to UNICEF.

You can help by talking about what your child is learning through this experience... and sharing your own thoughts. If he/she is going to Trick or Treat for UNICEF, discuss their rationale: How will they present themselves? How do they describe the UNICEF effort? And, if you are able, consider donating baked goods or packaged store snacks (chips, pretzels) for our UNICEF Bake Sale on next Tuesday.
