LATE BUS

Parent Portal PARENT PORTAL

PowerSchool Parent Portal provides you with the ability to check your child's attendance, grades, homework assignments or missing homework. You also may register to receive alert notifications, review daily comments from teachers and much more. PowerSchool allows you to have one login for each or your children. You can access PowerSchool with a Web Browser or by downloading an App on your smart device.

To set up your Parent Portal account you may go to www.elps.us > PARENTS > PowerSchool: Request a Parent Portal. This form can be used to request a new parent portal account as well as parents requesting to have a password reset. If this is your first time accessing PowerSchool you will need to obtain an Access ID and Access Password from the school.

PROOF OF RESDIENCY

If you have moved, please provide us with new documentation for your child's school record. The State of Michigan requires two pieces of proof of residency be on file for each student in the public school system. As a reminder, if you have moved out of the district you must complete a Continuation form and obtain a release of state aid from your resident district for your child to continue attending school at MacDonald. ATTENDANCE MATTERS AT MMS

As a reminder, the only time a tardy is excused when arriving late to school is when a student has been at an appointment. Please provide a slip from the doctor at the time they check in. Students may sign themselves in for school, however, we ask that if you are taking your child out of school early that you come into the office to sign them out.

Also, if your child is going to be absent please call the attendance line at 517-333-7601 to excuse the absence. The number is available 24 hours. Absences not called in will be marked as Unexcused. Parents will receive a message in the evening if a child has been marked unexcused absent or tardy.

EIGHTH GRADERS WILL TAKE PSAT

On Wednesday, October 11, our eighth grade students will be taking a grade level PSAT test. The purpose of the test is to give all students an opportunity to experience taking a college and career readiness test and to identify students who might benefit from advanced coursework.

It is important for students to be prepared on test day. Your student should answer all questions to his or her ability. It will also help if he or she gets plenty of sleep the night before and eats a good breakfast the morning of the test. Students must be to school on-time. The test will begin at 8:05 a.m. and will conclude by 11:45 a.m. There will not be an opportunity for students to take the test if they arrive late to school.
