Principal's Report Dori Leyko

- This year we have many students from MSU coming in to help Marble students. America Reads/America
 Counts tutors (paid) work with students who need remedial help: students placed based on schedules,
 teacher willingness, and student need; also have Service Learning tutors (unpaid) in classrooms and in
 lunch/recess duty--this will end in Nov. but we can reapply next semester. Honors Times Two students
 work with students who need enrichment.
- We started Weekend Survival Kits (Rotary Club); working with Libby Keenan to have bags of food sent home with qualifying students every-other week.
- Pen Pal program going well, especially outgoing mail to other schools (particularly Glencairn)
- In Art students are working on Art for Charlie pieces. Nov. 11 staff mtg will attend the AfC show.

- Working on a date for staff talent show and lunch for Top 10 Fun Run pledgers

- for increase in insurance costs? A: it is mandated by the state legislature. Until a contract is set, teachers have to pick up the increase in insurance premium.
