OFFICERS’ REPORTS

Treasurer’s Report

Amy Refior

- Not a lot of revenue this month, some expenses for Carnival, Wellness month, Mileage Club.
- Cash flow projection in regard to giving field trip money to each grade level. After a review by Amy Refior and Dan Bollman, we have about \$15,000 surplus. As well as an \$11,000 reserve. Based on numbers from the office, if we did \$5/grade/student it would amount to \$1710. Each grade would get \$200-\$300 per year to spend on field trips, for this school year, 2014-15. Amy makes the motion to approve \$1500 addition to budget for a \$5/student/year field trip donation, excluding the 4th grade since we provide them \$1500 for the Mackinac Island Trip. Second by Courtney. Motion passes.
- Mileage Club. This year MC asks to purchase t-shirts as incentives. The last time they were purchased was about three years ago and a parent took care of the expense. There are also misc expenses related to MC: keychains (which Sparrow is no longer providing), teacher participation incentives, etc. Amy makes the motion to approve an additional \$350 budget for MC for misc expenses as well as incentives and t-shirts. Emily seconds. Motion passes.
- Hospitality budgeting—right now we have \$500 and we spent about \$285 on the Family Picnic, and first day coffee and ice cream social. For the remainder of the year we will have May teacher appreciation week, last day of school thank-you-to-volunteers breakfast, last day of school teacher luncheon. Amy makes a motion to increase hospitality budget by \$200, up to \$700 for this year. Second by Courtney Trunk. Motion passes.

Principal’s Report

- Reading month events going on. Lauren Collier and Pam Nickleson are heading up the month’s activities. Zuzu African Acrobats are coming Monday, March 23, at 1:15 PM. All 5 elem. schools are bringing this group in for a cultural assembly.
- Hired another lunch monitor.
- Teachers attended PD today at the high school.
- M-Step begins after Spring Break (this replaces the MEAP.) 5th graders begin the Tuesday after Spring Break. Principals will work out schedules and communication. 5th graders take Math, Literacy, Social Studies. 4th grade does Math, Literacy, Science. This year Marble is taking it paper/pencil.
- Question: the story behind why 4/5th graders cannot send letters to Glencairn anymore. Answer: a few of the letters were found to be hurtful in content. Ms Leyko and Mrs. Keenan are talking through ways to allow students to continue this community-building practice in an acceptable manner.

Board of Education Report

- Approve food service contract for 2015-16
- Approved merit pay reaching back to 2010. Highly effective evals receive \$100/year, \$50/year for effective.
- Next steps for property at Red Cedar building. Discussion morphed into future vision of the district. Agreement that the property be used for education: STEM/STEAM (add “Arts”), preschool, unique preschool programming ideas were mentioned. No action has been taken. Lots of good public comment. We are working hard to engage the community in this decision. We have financial limitations. Next steps, BOE Pres has asked for individual board members to submit ideas for their vision re the property. Kate doesn’t feel this will be voted on quickly, but the board wants to work transparently and thoughtfully. It was announced that there has been interest from other companies to purchase the property, no bids yet, nothing done with that.
- Q from Ms Leyko re: Cole Academy charter school from Lansing, principal Brian, wants to expand into EL, looking at Bailey or Red Cedar buildings. Brian has been in communication with the BOE strategically, but Kate does not feel this is an option at this point.
