- Early Childhood Committee gave report at Board Meeting this week, also shared report with Bond Committee
- 211 responses to ECC survey (would have liked more responses) – 75% would enroll in tuition based, 67% interested in full day, 65% 5 day/week program, 18% in 4 day/week program, 16% in 3 day/week
- Working on understanding public enrollment needs in community, i.e. GSRP capacity only for 32 students, with 142 applicants
- Haslett blends tuition based with fed/state funded program, special needs – good model

Principal's Report & Presentation

- What? – So What? – Now What?
- Screening data comes in at beginning of October, then School Improvement Team goes through day-to-day data, they present to staff, then they work on class/school level, then staff meets with principal and reassesses
- AIMSWEB and MSTEP data available (snapshot in time - be careful giving too much credence)
 - MSTEP (replaced MEAP) spring '16 data: above state average, but subgroups not performing as well
 - ELA - (people researching this year's 4th grade cohort – interesting data...) some gaps
 - Marble has two subgroups (30+ group – gender and economically disadvantaged/free/reduced lunch)
 - MATH – a little more even year to year, easier to do math on computer than writing, typing during

- the test is a barrier (let's start practicing at home)
- SCIENCE – we are performing above state average, improving time given to science and social studies (Next Generation Standards are coming, replacing GLEC) District focus on Science this year, Sarah is elem. principal on this this year, working with Ms Leyko
- SOCIAL STUDIES –

PBIS Behavior Data:

- Office referral is for data collection, not as a consequence, and they are documenting a lot more this year
- Positive Behavior Support team (PBIS) meets once a month
- 40-50 referrals a month, not all having follow up with principal
- Minor physical contact, on playground, usually boys is biggest challenge
- How do boys play? Asking hard questions...
- Incidence of physical aggression and bullying are very low
- 57 students out of 360 received office referrals, 33 are male, 24 female
- Social worker working with small groups of students to reteach “2nd Step” lessons, Golden Tickets, and partnering with parents
- Kindness Club (Tali and Melissa for 3rd and 4th grade in afternoons) 23 kids signed up, starting tomorrow, relating to memory of Charlie Waller

AIMSWEB, Fall data: *see first/last slides for summaries

- Tier 1 is “one dose”, Tier 2 is “two doses”, Tier 3 “three doses” – extra instruction and check in
- New math curriculum this year, Tier 2 intervention is in-class for math, but no Tier 3 intervention
- Need to stay focused on significant gaps
- Programs to use at home: 10 Marks, Reflex Math, also typing programs
