
Whitehills Elementary Annual Education Report 2024-25 (AER)

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Whitehills Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Whitehills Elementary has been identified as a school without a designated performance label.

As a school, our foremost objective is to achieve academic excellence. At both the school and district levels, we are dedicated to meeting students at their current levels of academic proficiency while addressing any learning gaps that may have arisen in recent years. Through a commitment to continuous improvement, we employ evidence-based strategies to support student growth. By systematically monitoring progress and outcomes, we adapt our instructional approaches to ensure responsiveness and effectiveness in fostering student achievement.

Description of our School

Whitehills Elementary School currently serves 292 students, with two sections per grade level from kindergarten through fifth grade. The staff remains steadfast in



addressing the diverse needs of all students by analyzing school-wide data at least three times annually (fall, winter, and spring). Our efforts are focused on enhancing instructional delivery and closing the academic achievement gap between students performing at benchmark levels and those identified as lower-achieving. For the 2023-2024 school year, the percentage of Whitehills students achieving Advanced or Proficient levels in mathematics and English Language Arts (ELA) surpassed the state average for grades 3, 4, and 5.

Whitehills Elementary collaborates with other K-5 schools within the East Lansing Public Schools district to provide a high-quality education for all learners. Upper-grade teachers employ team-teaching strategies to facilitate the transition from self-contained classrooms in the early grades (K-3) to the more structured, six-period schedule of middle school. Our educational programming also prioritizes bullying prevention and intervention, incorporating initiatives such as the Second Step curriculum, Positive Behavior Intervention Support (PBIS), and the Bucket Filler reward program. Instructional staff engage in ongoing collaboration to review student data, develop targeted action plans, adjust teaching strategies, and refine the curriculum.

By leveraging an updated curriculum, evidence-based instructional practices, and advanced technology, Whitehills Elementary fosters a learning environment where every child can achieve their fullest potential and meet or exceed the high standards of East Lansing Public Schools. This collective effort reflects the dedication of students, administrators, support staff, and teachers.

At Whitehills, we are committed to providing all students with enriched academic experiences. We firmly believe that the greatest opportunity for student success lies in a robust partnership between families and the school, ensuring a united approach to supporting student growth and achievement.

Parent Teacher Conferences

Parent teacher conferences were held in person and virtually in the 2023-2024 school year with ninety-four percent of parents/guardians attending. Ninety-nine percent of students were represented by parents/guardians at fall conferences for the 2024- 2025 school year.

Status of the 3-5 Year District School Improvement Plan

East Lansing Public Schools has submitted a District Improvement Plan through the Michigan Integrated Continuous Improvement Process (MICIP). Our plan, in conjunction with our school community improves learning and improves health while coordinating policy, processes and practices that meet the needs of our students, educators and families. Description of Implementation

The implementation of the core curriculum is sustained through a curriculum structure that employs grade level and department chairpersons who meet monthly. The District and School Leaders review state requirements for core curriculum, plans curriculum development, coherence and articulation, provides for the identification of necessary professional development and budget-related requirements to support the implementation of the curriculum. The District and School Leaders meet with grade level and or department level colleagues and with administration to implement and monitor the effectiveness of curriculum development, implementation and impact on student performance.

Process for Assigning Pupils to the School District

K-5 students are assigned to schools based on where they reside in our district. Each K-5 school has specific boundaries within our district. Parents are allowed the opportunity to complete a permeable boundary request that would allow their child to attend a school within the school district other than their neighborhood school. Requests require the approval of the sending and receiving school Principals as well as the Superintendent and are based on space availability at the school/grade.

East Lansing Public Schools also participates in the state's Schools of Choice process annually. Available openings are advertised. Applications are accepted during a specific application period, and students are accepted on a lottery system to fill the advertised slots.
